On behalf of the Black Community Housing Advisory Table (BCHAT), we are writing to convey our strong encouragement for City Council to ensure City staff thoroughly assess and conduct the implementation of the recommendations in the Ombudsman's report *An Investigation into the City's Decision to Stop Allowing Refugee Claimants into Base Shelter System Beds*.

We are concerned by the City Manager's statements in his November 27<sup>th</sup> letter that he "does not agree with the findings" and will not implement the recommendations without directions from council. The response is publicly noted as the first time in the history of the Ombudsman's office that the Toronto Public Service has rejected the Ombudsman's findings and recommendations in their entirety. Building with the progress already underway or completed by implementing the Ombudsman's recommendations are critical steps to strengthen service alignment with the City's Housing Charter, Access TO, and Toronto Shelter Standards. We are confident that this action will help rebuild trust and nurture stronger partnerships with community organizations and residents.

Thank you for your consideration of this critical matter. We look forward to continued collaboration to ensure that Toronto is a city where all residents can thrive.
