PROGRAMMING

The second quarter of 2024 featured a wide array of activities across the Programming department.

TO Live Presents

- Toronto based pianist and composer [*Eve Egoyan*](#) performed a recital of all-Armenian music at the George Weston Recital Hall, featuring four Canadian premieres
- Kaha:wi Dance Theatre's [*SKéN:NEN*](#) explored Indigenous resilience within the self, community, and natural world through multimedia, theatre and original soundscapes. TO Live also provided audio description as part of the ongoing commitment to Accessibility
- TO Live co-commissioned the world premiere of [*John Coltrane: Legacy*](#) featuring lush orchestral arrangements of songs by the jazz legend, and performed by the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, Joe Lovano and an all-Toronto based rhythm section
- Two sold out nights of [*Pirates of The Caribbean: Curse of The Black Pearl*](#) also featured the Toronto Symphony Orchestra at Meridian Hall

- Meridian Arts Centre: Harold Green Jewish Theatre Company presented *In Seven Days*, performances by the Amadeus Choir and Toronto Mendelssohn Choir, and comedian Kathy Griffin

Ticket Services

- Q2 saw Ticket Services providing box office support and customer service for ticketed activity roughly proportional to Q2 of 2023 and representing an overall 10%+ increase on Q1 of 2024, with nearly 130K ticketed attendees and nearly 130K new tickets booked within the quarter.
- In coordination with Ticketmaster, TO Live phased out most Print-at-Home tickets, with all e-tickets now handled through digital wallets or Ticketmaster's mobile app. This initiative was undertaken to reduce fraud, better protect TO Live and patrons from bad actors, and continue guiding ticketing from a proof-of-possession system towards a proof-of-ownership model.

Improved and expanded use of the Universe and Account Manager platforms was undertaken, helping support TO Live's co-presentation of Murmuration, several events at the Elgin & Winter Garden Theatre, and the ticket and passes onsale launch of the inaugural UpFRONT Festival of Indigenous Arts, Music and Culture.

Ticketmaster Update

- In June, it was reported that there was a data breach pertaining to information from the Ticketmaster system. Ticketmaster confirmed that between April 2, 2024 and May 18, 2024, an unauthorized party obtained information Ticketmaster data from a cloud database hosted by a third-party data service provider. This included customer information from North American markets and may have included TO Live patron data. The information obtained by the third party included patron names, basic contact information (mailing addresses, phone numbers, email addresses), and incomplete payment information such as partial credit & debit card numbers and expiration dates. The full scope of how many patron records were breached has not been disclosed.

Since the information did not encompass full payment information, passwords, etc, the primary threat arising from this breach is not direct identity theft or payment fraud, but rather social engineering. The partial information obtained could be utilized in phishing schemes, scareware attacks, etc.

It should be noted that Ticketmaster's softwares (TM Host, Archtics, Universe) were not affected by this incident. In the time since the incident, Ticketmaster has worked with U.S. federal law enforcement on investigating how it occurred and determining next steps for future prevention. Various enhanced security measures have since been implemented, including rotating passwords for the affected cloud database, review and revision of access permissions across all platforms, and new alerting mechanisms for better detection of unexpected activity in the digital environment.



On July 8 2024, Ticketmaster sent a notification to all North American account holders with a full explanation of the above. Since this was sent to the full database, receipt of this message is not confirmation of any specific patron account being part of the breach. Their notification included advice to patrons on what to look out for and how to ensure best protection in online spaces, and also offered all patrons identity monitoring services from TransUnion of Canada, Inc. (specialists in fraud assistance and remediation) for 1 year at no cost. TO Live's box office team has been kept up-to-date with all pertinent information to advise patrons and to guide them as appropriate to Ticketmaster's resources pertaining to the incident.

Facility Services

- Recertified safety relief valve on the steam line at STLC
- Conducted testing and recalibration of refrigerant gas detection system at MH & MAC
- Conducted annual service and load bank testing on the emergency power generator at MH & MAC
- Installed a temporary backup generator during repairs to the water pump and belt on the emergency power generator at MH
- Assessed and remediated discovered mould in a limited location at the STLC
- Shutdown the steam supply at MH & STLC and conducted chiller start-up for the season at all locations
- Assisted the kitchen with the installation of the roof garden at MH

Patron Services and Event Services

- Welcomed approximately 136,841 visitors to our venues
- Expanded show-specific concessions for our film and orchestra series by adding mixed cocktails and themed snacks during "Pirates of the Caribbean"
- Increased popcorn availability at more shows
- Introduced new staff engagement activities, including staff trivia night and drag bingo event
- Performed inaugural planting of the new rooftop garden at MH to support TO Live corporate catering

CAPITAL PROJECTS

- **Meridian Arts Centre** highlights include:
 - AODA Work Package 5 (Theatres Phase 2): completed
 - AODA Work Package 6 (Offices and Lunchrooms): completed. Working on close out documents and deficiencies



- AODA Work Package 7 (Back of House support Phase 1): phase 1 completed. Construction of phase 2 is ongoing
 - Technical Theatres Improvements: progressing on schedule
 - Rigging Replacement for GWRH and Lyric: work has begun in the Lyric
 - MAC Exterior Repair: completed
 - NET Zero Carbon Initiatives: final report has been received
- **Meridian Hall** highlights include:
 - Door Replacement: doors installed, working on remaining hardware and finishes
 - Accessibility - Work Package 4 (Front and Back of House Services): 95% completed. Bronze doors will be installed mid-August
 - Accessibility – Work Package 5 (Lobby Washrooms Phase 2): phase 1 completed. Phase 2 will start Q4 2024
 - Accessibility - Work Package 6 (Venue Renovations): tendering late summer. Working on tender documents
 - Exterior Envelope & Site Work: 50% completed. Waiting for delivery of long lead item materials and progressing as per construction schedule.
