City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 349

- Dangerous act was severe
- Dangerous act was the second or subsequent on record with the City
- Dangerous act occurred while dog was subject to a muzzle order/notice of caution/control order


A brief description of the dangerous act
--

**Max was not in the control of a person and caused severe injuries to a dog.**

As a result of this Order, you must ensure the dog named above complies with the following conditions at all times as per section 349-15.1 of Municipal Code Chapter 349, Animals:

1. The dog must be muzzled at all times when off its owner's property;
2. The dog is not permitted to enter into a designated leash-free area of a City park;
3. The dog must wear a dangerous dog tag which the owner has purchased from the City;
4. The owner must post a warning sign in the following location(s):  
**ALL ENTRY DOORS TO HOME**
5. The dog must be microchipped within 14 days of this order;
6. The dog owner must provide a photograph of the dog to the City; and
7. The dog must receive training within 90 days of this order, and proof of completion must be sent to the City within 14 days of completion.

In accordance with section 349-16 of Municipal Code Chapter 349, Animals, you may appeal this Order to the Dangerous Dog Review Tribunal within 30 days of the date of service noted below. Details on how to make an appeal can be found on the reverse of this form. **Please note that you must continue to comply with this Order until the Dangerous Dog Review Tribunal hears and decides your appeal.**

## **Appeal of order**

In accordance with section 349-16 of Municipal Code Chapter 349, Animals, you may appeal this Order to the Dangerous Dog Review Tribunal within **30 days of the date of service noted on the order form**.

To make an appeal, you must:

1. Complete and return a request for appeal form to Toronto Animal Services; and
2. Pay the appeal fee of **\$374.14**

Please take note of the Order reference number and date the Order was served as you will need that information on your request for appeal form.
