Trail 7 Accessibility Node - Infrastructure (1)

Renaturalization & Planting

- Important to preserve privacy and provide comparable experience to the dune entry points

Trail 7 Pathway Connector

- Paved asphalt trail from the Gibraltar Point washroom to the beach
- 90 metres long, 3 metres wide, AODA compliant design with tactile paving/plates

Beach Trail

- Mobi-mat, sand/wood colour
- North running parallel to the fence, offering sun exposure
- West running parallel to tree line, offering shade
- Each direction is 30 metres long, 1.5 metres wide (order two 100ft x 5ft products total)

Beach Pads

- Mobi-mat, sand/wood colour
- Each pad is 3 m^2 (1.5 m x 1.5 m) (order four custom 5ft x 5ft mats total)

Wheel-Trans Drop-Off & Turnaround

- Paved asphalt parking/turnaround pad adjacent to the road
- 6 metres long, 5 metres wide, assuming ProMaster CS2 bus model, verify with TTC

Gibraltar Washroom Improvements

- Hoyer lift system to enable transfers to toilet
- Investigate possibility of converting the washroom to include a shower and change table, consult https://www.changing-places.org/ for reference designs.

Outdoor Shower (if above is not possible)

- Screened for privacy with 2m solid wood panel fencing
- Height adjustable shower with handheld shower wand
- Adjacent adult change table, durable plastic material that drains easily
- Locking pole/shed for a water wheelchair

Water wheelchair

- Water wheelchair available for <u>free</u> to rent
- PFR to figure out a lock with remotely changeable codes to allow for booking via PFR's online space rental portal

Drinking fountain and water bottle refill

- Accessible drinking fountain and accessible water bottle refill stand

Trail 7 Accessibility Node - Policy

Getting There

- TTC pilot project to provide access to Toronto Island via Wheel-Trans on vehicle ferry on certain weekends. Dates to be determined by Wheel-Trans staff and TAAC members.
- PFR pilot project to waive the vehicle fee for wheelchair accessible vans transporting someone in a wheelchair on the vehicle ferry.

Enjoying Time There

- PFR pilot project to station a licenced PSW at the Gibraltar Point washroom on the same weekends as the Wheel-Trans pilot project. Hours to be determined by TAAC members.
- Friends of Hanlan's to plan a gathering with Pride Toronto's Accessibility Committee specifically celebrating queer and trans folks living with disabilities once infrastructure and policy requirements are met.
