Giorgio Mammoliti ran for mayor in the 2023 by-election. He obtained an extension to his filing deadline to December 10, 2023, on the basis of audit issues, indicating that he spent more than \$10,000 on the campaign. He then failed to file a financial statement by the deadline or after it (filing after the deadline would not avoid automatic disqualification but the clerk would still have posted the statement online):

I believe a compliance audit is warranted to determine whether any additional campaign finance violations were committed. This candidate has a history of campaign finance violations, having pled guilty to violations of the MEA in 2014 for exceeding the spending cap by 44%. He is a long-time municipal politician and candidate who is well aware of the filing requirements:

There is also evidence of significant spending on this campaign, including an expensive campaign launch (<https://www.instagram.com/p/Crklvo3uisA/?igsh=ZjBoeJzbnCwd2pm>) and numerous robocalls (<https://twitter.com/vickiessex/status/1659288323930693632?s=61&t=5BPXY6RW4151aJ2l6c4JtA>):

There is therefore reason to believe that the failure to file was deliberate to avoid exposing irregularities that could lead to a compliance audit and more significant penalties than the automatic disqualification:

I believe on reasonable grounds that the candidate or registered third party noted above has contravened a provision of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, relating to election campaign finances.
