The results of this form will be assessed in conjunction with other documentation submitted as part of the Noise Exemption Permit Package. In determining whether to grant a Noise Exemption Permit and whether specific conditions should be applied to the exemption permit, the Executive Director, MLS, shall also consider the economic and/or cultural benefits to the City at-large in providing the exemption.
