Dear Members of the Economic and Development Committee,

On behalf of Northcrest Developments (Northcrest), I am writing to express my strong support for the City-led Downsview Area Secondary Plan and its accompanying Community Development Plan (CDP). As a representative of Northcrest, long-time North York resident, an alumnus of the neighbouring York University, and vocal advocate deeply rooted in the Downsview community, I am proud to voice my endorsement of these plans. I extend my gratitude to the Chair and members of the Economic and Development Committee for considering this submission, Councillor James Pasternak, and deeply appreciate the care and collaboration by City staff throughout this process.

The CDP, which is only the second ever produced by the City of Toronto, is the culmination of an extensive engagement process where we sought out to truly understand the community's priorities. Our process, which was carried out in close collaboration with City staff, included deep and thoughtful engagement with a diverse set of stakeholders and partners: residents, businesses, community organizations, equity-deserving groups, and Indigenous peoples. Initiated well in advance of a development application being submitted, it involved numerous focus groups, consultations, and events spanning a wide spectrum of interests and perspectives.

In fact, over the past four years, Northcrest has conducted an unparalleled outreach initiative, engaging with over 300 different organizations and more than 6,000 individuals. This extensive outreach underscores our own commitment to transparent and inclusive community engagement, which serves as the bedrock of our planning process. As part of this submission, we have prepared an Engagement Report detailing our activities and findings, which is appended for your reference.

The views we gathered directly shaped both the Downsview Framework Plan and the CDP before you, aligning Northcrest and the City of Toronto's vision to build upon Downsview's rich history, unlocking the long overdue potential of the Downsview Airport Lands through the development of complete communities. These communities will feature vibrant new neighbourhoods seamlessly connected and enriched with 100 acres of parks, paths, and

greenspace. You'll also see an emphasis on jobs, growth, and local procurement along with greater access to workplace development and training programs. We've charted a plan for more affordable commercial spaces, employment in growth industries and the over-arching commitment to a more inclusive economy that better shares prosperity across the entire community. Along with the City, we hope to put our collective efforts towards attracting new employers, bolstering the existing small business community, and generating thousands of new jobs, contributing to local prosperity.

For far too long, emphasis on inclusionary growth, shared economy benefits, along with and meaningful community outreach and partnerships was regarded as an afterthought – something developers *had* to do but didn't seek out. I'm proud to work at Northcrest where it's not only an indisputable priority, but a forethought, guiding all of our work.

Your endorsement of this plan will literally change the course and trajectory of our city's northwest – an area long overlooked and greatly underinvested. If passed, this plan will set a new precedent and standard for engagement, collaboration, and ultimately, the potential of projects to create not just new communities, but shared prosperity.

Northcrest Engagement Report

Introduction to Northcrest's Engagement in Downsview

For us at Northcrest, community engagement is the bedrock of planning for thriving complete communities at Downsview. From the outset, we've approached engagement with a firm belief that thoughtfully-planned new neighbourhoods create positive impact for both new and existing communities; that a comprehensive plan for 370 acres of land requires meaningful collaboration with the Indigenous Rights-Holders, African, Caribbean and Black communities, the City of Toronto, and Downsview communities and city-wide stakeholders; and that engagement needs to be responsive to evolving community and public policy priorities as well as our responsibility as stewards of these lands. We are committed to continuing these efforts over the coming years as the project evolves.

We are very proud to share this report, which provides a snapshot of all Northcrest's engagement activities since 2020:

- 1. **Over 120 engagement activities** that were either led by Northcrest for the Taxiway District Plan, co-led with Canada Lands as part of id8 Framework, or in support of the City of Toronto-led consultations as part of Update Downsview;
- 2. Outreach to **over 80,000 people and hundreds of organizations** through direct mail, the id8 e-newsletter, email, phone calls, site activation events, via social media.
- 3. Feedback from **nearly 6,000 voices** at townhalls, focus groups, sharing circles, community-led focussed discussions, open houses, surveys, and other engagement formats held synchronously in-person, virtually, in a hybrid format, as well asynchronously over web-platforms, mail, and telephone.
- 4. Working with over 184 local, indigenous, and equity deserving artists as part of XOXO Downsview, Toronto's Year of Public Art, and more.

To reduce barriers to participation, all engagement materials have been available by request in the six most commonly spoken languages in Downsview – with pronounced efforts made to reach the surrounding Italian, Hispanic, and Filipino communities. Additionally, special accommodations for individuals with specific needs have been readily provided upon request.

Given that Northcrest's engagement began two years before the Update Downsview and the Community Development Plan processes started, we promptly acted on feedback received from the community. Furthermore, the alignment of the community's priorities with Northcrest's vision and early work on workforce development and the support of arts and culture, enabled us to begin work on the Workforce Development and Social Procurement actions from the outset through our Site Activation and Programming, and by hosting the first Downsview Workforce Development Forum, in November of 2023.

In conjunction with this work, we are thrilled to be the first developer to have signed onto the City Of Toronto's pilot Community Benefits Plan, for the Downsview Airport Lands.

We are thankful for all the participants in our engagement processes for providing valuable insights that have informed, and will continue to inform, our work moving forward. We are particularly grateful for the open and continuous dialogue with our First Nations partners, for discussions with African, Caribbean and Black voices in and around Downsview, for feedback coming directly from the youth-led peer engagement, and for all the local residents, businesses, and organizations that tirelessly continue to show up and work with us. We have heard loud and clear about the importance of respectful integration, the need for both affordable housing and commercial spaces, access to community services and facilities, well-connected parks, resilient city-nature, improved mobility, and local employment and workforce development. We are committed to continuing listening, learning, and moving forward together to achieving the 30+ year vision at Downsview.
