Re: 2024.EC17.4, Shelter Safety Action Plan

1. Declare a right to shelter in the City of Toronto.

There can be no safety in the city's shelter system when there is no declared **right to shelter** in the Shelter, Support and Housing Administration's mandate. This human rights value should be informed by city divisions that respond to equity and access such as Ombudsman Toronto, the Indigenous Affairs Office, Environment and Climate, People and Equity, Public Health to name a few.

2. Expand the emergency shelter system. Act as if a natural disaster has hit Toronto.

The city's own statistics show that over 220 people are declined shelter daily because the system is full. We know the need is much higher.

3. The city's three decade old response to inclimate weather, most notably it's <u>Winter Services Plan for People Experiencing Homelessness</u> is by the city's own admission not going to meet the need for shelter. The annual pretense to provide shelter through expanded respite options and warming centres that are temperature dependent is a policy affront to those who need shelter any day of the year. Furthermore, it ignores the <u>science of climate change</u>.
