The Islington Ratepayers & Residents Association (IRRA) is strongly in favour of the motion to direct City Planning staff to conduct a scoped review of existing Islington Village policies and guidelines, identify opportunities for placemaking, and recommend policy or guideline updates to better maintain the village character.
