Comments:

I live in Toronto, near to the Queen and Bathurst site of the Parkdale-Queen West Community Health Centre, and therefore to the Safe Consumption Site hosted there. I work at St Stephen-in-the-Fields Church, just around the corner from the Kensington Market Overdose Prevention Site (in fact, the harms reduction kits which they hand out are assembled at my church).

I know that the Board of Health understands very well the lifesaving importance of these sites. I know that you're aware the closing these sites will result in thousands of deaths. Many of those deaths will be my neighbours and friends.

Given this, I want to implore you, with all the strength I have, not to accept the closure of these sites as a *fait accompli*. The legislation required to put this closure into effect has not yet passed. There are very real legal and constitutional challenges already being prepared. If you bind yourselves to a budget which assumes the closure of these sites as already a given, you are allowing yourselves to be used as tools of Doug Ford's murderous agenda.

I believe that you are our allies in this struggle. Please don't pass a budget which will require you to collaborate in such grievous harm.
