

## **Selection of Candidates for Interview for the Committee of Adjustment**

### **REASON FOR CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION**

---

This report deals with personal matters about identifiable individuals who are being considered for appointment to the Committee of Adjustment.

### **SUMMARY**

---

The Nominating Panel – Committee of Adjustment will select candidates to be interviewed for appointment by City Council to the Committee of Adjustment. The Nominating Panel will conduct interviews at its next meeting and recommend three candidates to City Council for appointment.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

---

The City Clerk recommends that:

1. The Nominating Panel – Committee of Adjustment select 9 candidates listed in Table 1 of Confidential Attachment 1 to interview at its next meeting for appointment to the Committee of Adjustment.
2. The Nominating Panel – Committee of Adjustment direct that Confidential Attachments 1-2 remain confidential in their entirety as they relate to personal matters about identifiable individuals being considered for appointment to the Committee of Adjustment.

## COMMENTS

---

### Composition of the Committee of Adjustment

The Committee of Adjustment is composed of 35 members of the public organized into four panels corresponding to the Community Council boundaries, as follows:

- Etobicoke York: 8 panel members;
- North York: 10 panel members;
- Toronto and East York: 12 panel members;
- Scarborough: 5 panel members.

The applications heard by each panel correspond with the Community Council boundaries.

Under the *Planning Act*, members of each panel of the Committee of Adjustment elect their own Chair.

### **There are currently four positions under consideration**

The four positions under considerations are the result of resignations from members on the North York Panel, the Toronto and East York Panel and the Scarborough Panel.

### **Term of office**

Under the *Planning Act*, the term of office for public members of the Committee of Adjustment is coincident with the term of the council that appointed them. The public members will serve a term of office ending November 14, 2026, continuing to serve until their successors are appointed.

### **Eligibility for the Committee of Adjustment**

In addition to the general eligibility requirements set out in the Public Appointments Policy, members cannot act as agents for applicants before the Committee of Adjustment. Former Council members who served in the immediately preceding term of Council are ineligible for appointment as public members on the Committee.

### **Committee members must meet certain qualifications**

Public members should collectively bring the following skills and expertise to the committee:

- a strong interest in the complexities and challenges of city building
- an understanding of the diverse neighbourhoods and communities across the city
- have knowledge in one or more areas of: law, planning, architecture, government, economic development, community development, land development, urban forestry and environmental planning, or citizen advocacy
- demonstrate decision-making, communication, and mediation skills to facilitate an open and fair hearing process
- each panel should have at least 2 members with adjudication experience and administrative public speaking and organizational skills to be able to chair public hearings and maintain order in conflict situations

### **Committee members receive remuneration**

Public members, including the Chair, receive full-day per diem of \$460 and half-day remuneration (3.5 hours or less) of \$275 for hearings, business meetings or training sessions.

Each public member who is not a chair will receive a stipend of \$1,500 per year, pro-rated on an annual basis from the time of appointment. Chairs will receive an annual stipend of \$2,500, pro-rated on an annual basis from the time of appointment.

## **Shortlisted candidates will write an assignment and be interviewed**

Candidates must complete an assignment related to the roles and responsibilities of Committee of Adjustment members. The Nominating Panel - Committee of Adjustment will be provided with the assignment scores during the interviews.

## **Public Appointments staff have consulted with City Planning staff**

In preparation to fill the vacancy, Public Appointments staff consulted with City Planning staff to discuss skills and qualifications, current board needs, and the appointments process.

## **Outreach was conducted for the vacancies**

Targeted outreach to attract skilled and diverse candidates included promotions on LinkedIn and Twitter, contacting professional associations and communication via the Public Appointments e-updates list.

## **Next steps - Interviews**

Once the Nominating Panel - Committee of Adjustment has selected candidates for interviews, the City Clerk's Office will contact the candidates to schedule them for 20 minute interviews. Nine interviews plus deliberations will take approximately 3.5 hours to complete.
