## 143 Main Street

143 Main Street, Heritage Planning, 2024.

Constructed in 1927, the property at 143 Main Street has design value as a representative example of an early-twentieth century Main Street Commercial Row type building with commercial uses at grade. It also housed the community's post office from the 1930s to the 1950s<sup>2</sup>

The building is valued for its direct association with the Snell family, a historically-significant family in the early development of East Toronto.

## 154 Main Street

The property at 154 Main Street has design value as a representative example of an early-twentieth century Main Street Commercial Block type building. Originally constructed in 1909, the building experienced a fire in 1918 and was partially reconstructed by 1920. The building is valued for its direct association with the Snell family, a historically-significant family in the early development of the Town of East Toronto.

## 164 Main Street

Constructed in 1903, the property at 164 Main Street has design value as a representative example of an early-twentieth century Main Street Commercial Block type building.
