What is the Toronto Employment Survey?

Annual Snapshot of Toronto's economy

- Contacted 72,530 business establishments across the City
- Collect business employment counts and employment-related land use information
- Classify employment by economic sector and land use activity

Field Survey of All Business Establishments

- Return to the field survey method consistent with pre-pandemic operations
- Businesses were contacted via in-person visits
- Follow-up was conducted via telephone calls and e-mails

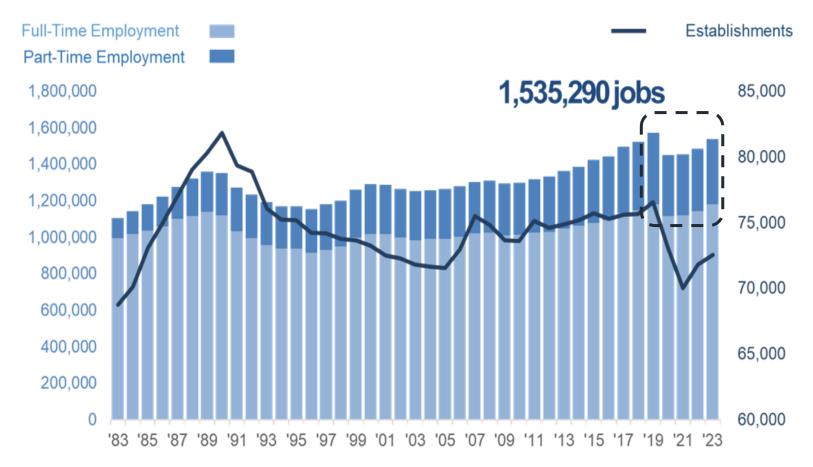


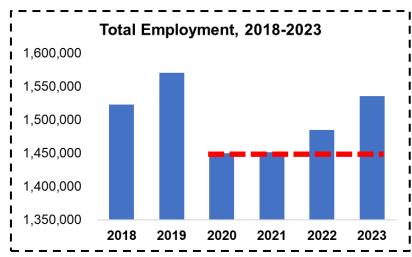
TES 2023: Economic Recovery Highlights

- Toronto has regained 70% of the pandemic-related job losses seen in 2020, but recovery is uneven across sectors.
 - Office and Institutional categories made up the majority of job growth in 2023.
 - Service and Retail categories both exhibited some growth this year, but have not recovered from the pandemic losses.
 - Hybrid work is here to stay, but businesses are starting to increase inoffice work days.



Employment up 3.4%, Establishments up 1.0%



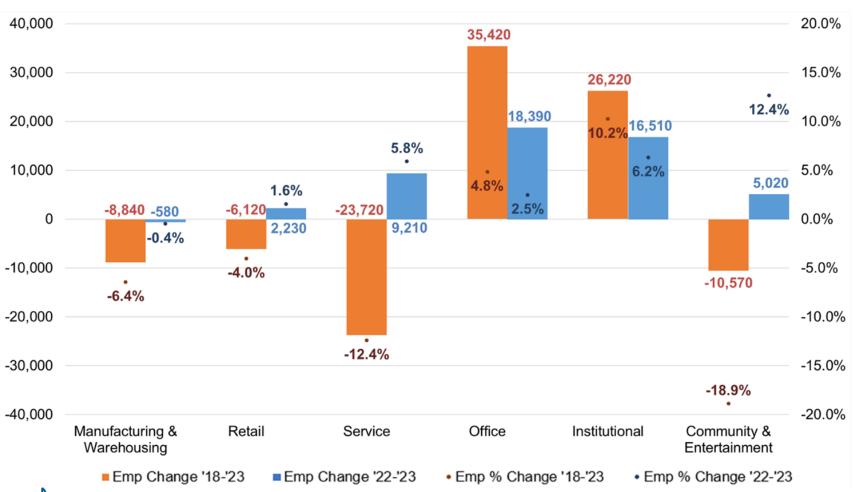


2023 employment grew by **50,690 jobs** or **3.4%** from 2022, compared to 2.3% growth between 2021 and 2022.

Establishments increased by **730** or **1.0%** to a total of **72,730** in 2023.



Economic impact by category

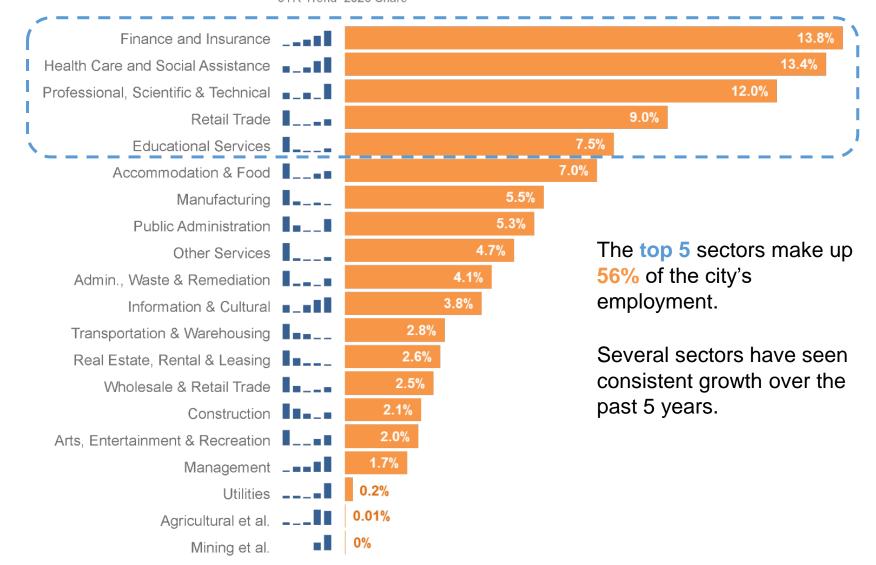






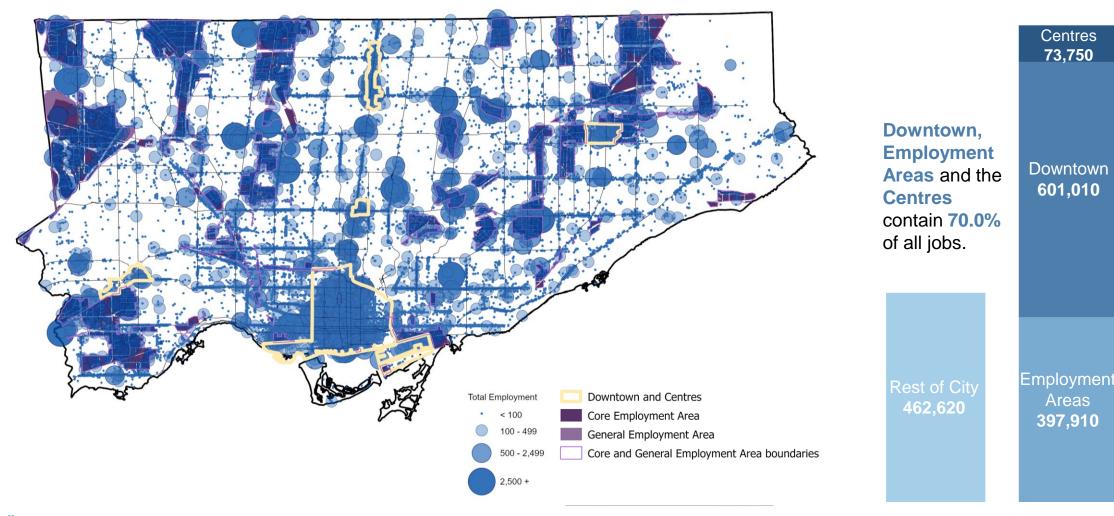
Employment by NAICS sector

Downtown

- Downtown contains 601,010
 jobs, 39% of the city's total
- In 2023, Downtown employment was up by 6.4% adding 36,020 jobs
- Office led net employment gains Downtown in 2023
- New office construction has pushed up vacancy rates

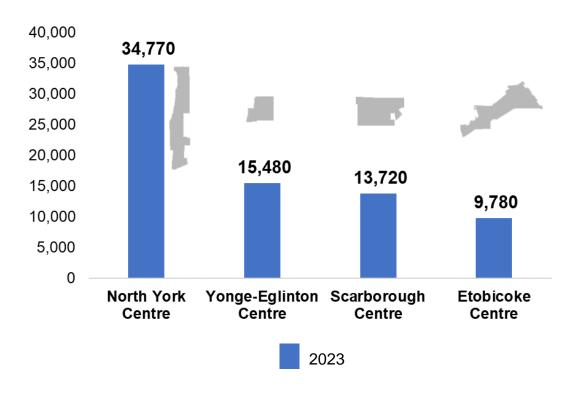
2022 - 2023 Employment Change



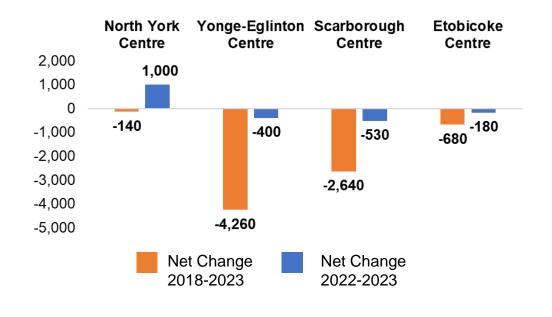


Centres

The Centres contain 73,750 jobs

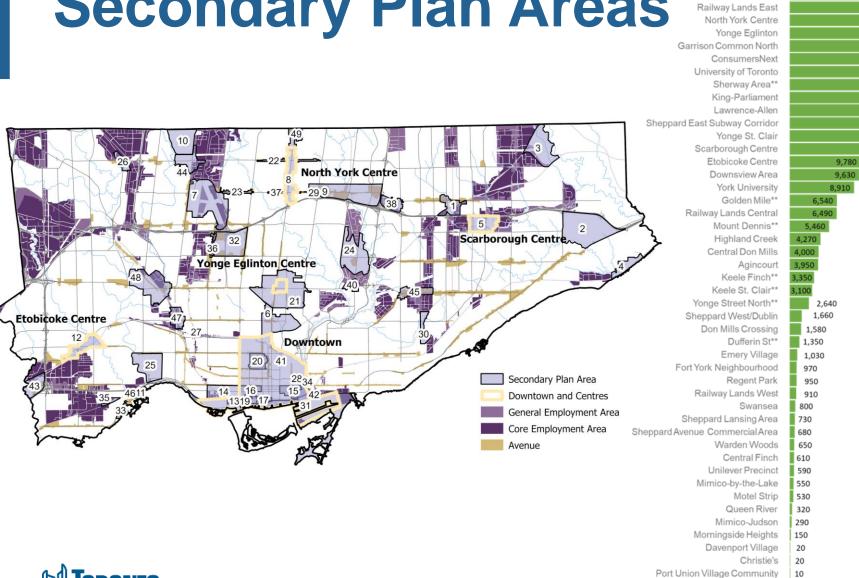


Total Employment has **decreased** in the Centres

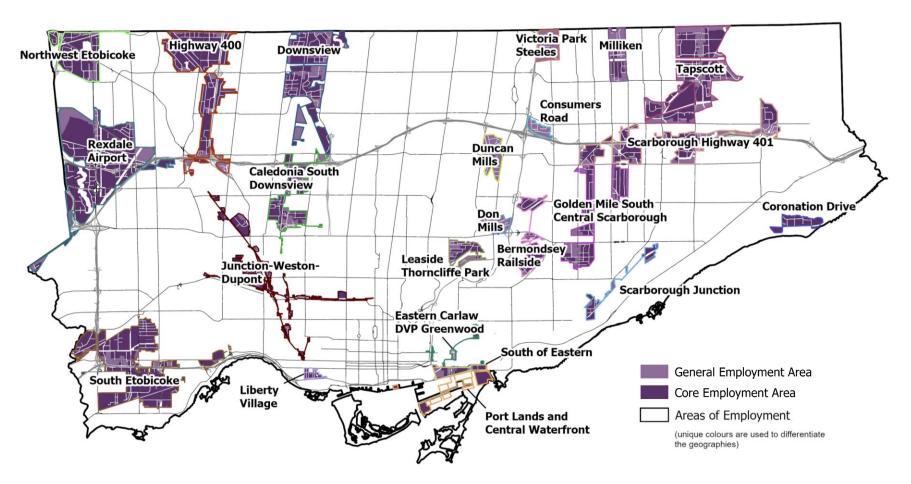

The **Office** category is the predominant source (63%) of Secondary Plan area employment.

Employment Areas account for 26% of citywide employment and 30% of all establishments in the city

Employment by 2051

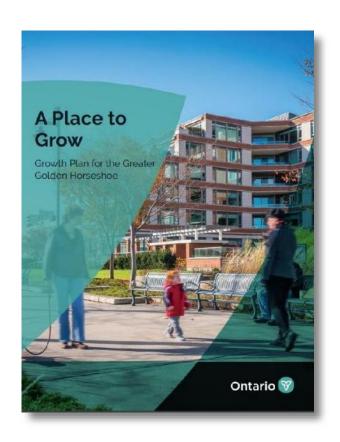
• 1,980,000 jobs, **growth of 372,000 jobs** over 35 years

Pandemic impact on growth

- The 2013-2023 average growth rate is **1.2%**.
- The City will reach the Provincial Growth Plan forecast well before 2051, in approximately **29 years**.

Pre-pandemic growth

- The 2009-2019 pre-pandemic average growth rate was **2.0%**.
- At the pre-pandemic growth rate, the City would reach the forecast in approximately **13 years**.





Observations



Economic Recovery

 As of 2023, the City has regained about 60% of the businesses and 70% of the jobs that were lost due to COVID-19 pandemic impacts

Category Impacts

- Office remained resilient with minimal fluctuation, accelerated shift to hybrid work
- Service, Community and Entertainment experienced severe and prolonged employment impacts from the public safety measures and changes in consumer behaviour, though growth has returned in 2023

Hybrid Work

- About 10.1% of establishments confirmed having staff working remotely at least some of the time, up from 6.8% in 2022
- One in four establishments that adopted a hybrid work model reported having employees work on-site three days a week on average
