



FURTHER INFORMATION

The comprehensive vision for Villiers Island is the development of a vibrant, sustainable community on a newly created Island within the Port Lands, surrounded by new parkland and bounded by the Don River valley. Future developments are anticipated to accommodate a minimum of 15,000 residents and provide approximately 3,000 jobs within the next 25 years, detail a path to realize the community's potential through diverse, inclusive, and environmentally responsible growth, with a goal of 30% of the residential Gross Floor Area on publicly owned lands to be affordable housing units.

The proposed Official Plan Amendment and Zoning By-law Amendment implement the updated vision for Villiers Island.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Toronto on the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment, you must make a written request to the City Clerk Attention: Nancy Martins, Administrator at the address, fax number or e-mail set out above.

Official Plan and Zoning By-law Amendment Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to

the City of Toronto before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted or refused and the Zoning Bylaw Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

If a person or public body does not make oral submission at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted or refused and the Zoning By-Law Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s). If you are submitting letters, faxes, e-mails, presentations or other communications to the City, you should be aware that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and will appear on the City's website. The City will also make your communication and any personal information in it - such as your postal address, telephone number or e-mail address - available to the public, unless you expressly request the City to remove it.

Many Committee, Board and Advisory Body meetings are broadcast live over the internet for the public to view. If you speak at the meeting, you will appear in the video broadcast.
