Notice is hereby given that City officials are recommending to Toronto City Council the enactment of a by-law amending the City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 441, Fees and Charges to introduce a new administration fee of 30 cents per square metre of eligible gross floor area for projects receiving Economic Development and Growth in Employment (EDGE) Incentive Program Development Grants.
