PROPOSAL

The application to amend Zoning By-law and the Draft Plan of Subdivision application propose to a mixeduse development with three towers with heights of 37, 33 and 18 storeys and an 8-storey mid-rise building at 1125 to 1137 Markham Road and 2141 Ellesmere Road. The proposal includes 997 residential units, 71,038 square metres of residential gross-floor area, 1,157 square metres of non-residential gross floor area, a northsouth public road, the completion of an east-west public road and 830 square metres of public parkland.
