PROPOSAL

City of Toronto is proposing a comprehensive amendment to the Official Plan, to facilitate the transportation and servicing infrastructure needs in the Highland Creek Village Area, and to support its current and long-term redevelopment based on the Highland Creek Village Transportation Master Plan study, endorsed by City Council on May 5 and 6, 2021. Additional objectives include creating a balanced multi-modal transportation network, attracting investment to the community and improving the area's various streetscapes.

Amendments to the Official Plan include:

- Map 3 Right-of-Way Widths Associated with Existing Major Streets is proposed to be amended to identified streets in the Highland Creek Village Transportation Master Plan where right-of-way widenings are being proposed, revised, or removed as part of the recommended Transportation Master Plan;
- Schedule 1 Existing Minor Streets with Right-of-Way Widths Greater than 20 Metres, is proposed to be amended to identified streets in the Highland Creek Village Transportation Master Plan where right-of-way widenings are being proposed, or removed as part of the recommended Transportation Master Plan;
- Schedule 2 The Designation of Planned but Unbuilt Roads is proposed to be amended to identified streets in the Highland Creek Village Transportation Master Plan where a new street is being proposed as part of the recommended Transportation Master Plan;
- Chapter 6 Highland Creek Community Secondary Plan is proposed to be amended by adding certain policies to Section 2 Site and Area Specific Policies;
- Chapter 6 Highland Creek Community Secondary Plan is proposed to be amended by adding certain policies and lands to Map 2-1: Urban Structure Plan, and Map 2-2: Highland Creek Village Plan, as Site and Area Specific Policy 2.18.



Official Plan Amendment Appeal: If a specified person or public body as defined under the Planning Act or the registered owner of any land to which the plan would apply would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the specified person or public body as defined under the Planning Act or the registered owner of any land to which the plan would apply does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted, the specified person or public body as defined under the Planning Act or the registered owner of any land to which the plan would effined under the Planning Act or the registered owner of any land to which the plan would apply is not entitled to appeal the decision to adopt the proposed Official Plan Amendment.

People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s). If you are submitting letters, faxes, e-mails, presentations or other communications to the City, you should be aware that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and will appear on the City's website. The City will also make your communication and any personal information in it - such as your postal address, telephone number or e-mail address - available to the public, unless you expressly request the City to remove it.
