SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to recommend to City Council the appointment of Council Members to the City of Toronto Long-Term Care Committee of Management.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The City Clerk recommends that:

1. The Striking Committee consider Members' preferences and eligibility and recommend to City Council the appointment of a Council Member to the City of Toronto Long-Term Care Committee of Management for a term of office until November 14, 2026, and until a successor is appointed.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

DECISION HISTORY

The Striking Committee, at its meeting on December 6, 2023, referred [Item ST4.2](#) to the City Clerk, in consultation with the General Manager, Seniors Services and Long-Term Care, to ensure that all necessary steps have been followed prior to submitting a report on the membership of the City of Toronto Long-Term Care Committee of Management to the Striking Committee, such steps to include a new canvass of Members of Council for their interest in membership on the committee, if required.

City Council, at its meeting on November 8 and 9, 2023, established the City of Toronto Long-Term Care Committee of Management and directed the City Clerk to initiate an appointment process through the Striking Committee for the appointment of Members to the Committee.

COMMENTS

The City of Toronto Long-Term Care Committee of Management is a requirement under the Fixing Long-Term Care Act, 2021, which regulates Ontario's long-term care sector.

The composition of the Committee is three Members of Council, appointed by City Council on recommendation of the Striking Committee.

As a condition of membership, members of the City of Toronto Long-Term Care Committee of Management are required to provide a police record check and signed declaration in accordance with the Fixing Long-Term Care Act, 2021.

The City Clerk has canvassed Members for their interest in appointment to the City of Toronto Long-Term Care Committee of Management. Members' responses have been summarized in Attachment 1.

The General Manager, Seniors Services and Long-Term Care has advised the City Clerk that the interested Member identified in Attachment 1 has met the requirement of a completed police check and is eligible for membership on the Committee.
