

## **Introduction of Overnight On-Street Permit Parking - Permit Area 9A Newman Avenue**

### **SUMMARY**

---

This staff report is about a matter that Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

Transportation Services is recommending that overnight on-street permit parking be introduced on Newman Avenue between Secord Avenue and Goodwood Park Crescent from 12:01 a.m. to 7:00 a.m., within permit Area 9A.

Residents requested the implementation of overnight on-street permit parking on Newman Avenue to accommodate their long-term parking needs.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

---

The Director, Permits and Enforcement, Transportation Services recommends that:

1. Toronto and East York Community Council authorize parking by permit only on an area basis, from 12:01 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. daily on the even (west) side of Newman Avenue between Secord Avenue and Goodwood Park Crescent, within Area 9A.
2. Toronto and East York Community Council rescind the existing parking prohibition in effect at all times during the months of May, July, September and November on the east side of Newman Avenue, between Secord Avenue and Goodwood Park Crescent.
3. Toronto and East York Community Council rescind the existing parking prohibition in effect at all times during the months of January, February, March, April, June, August, October and December, on the west side of Newman Avenue, between Secord Avenue and Goodwood Park Crescent.

4. Toronto and East York Community Council prohibit parking at all times on the odd (east) side of Newman Avenue, between Secord Avenue and Goodwood Park Crescent.

## **FINANCIAL IMPACT**

---

The estimated funding to implement permit parking is \$1930 which is available within Transportation Services 2024 Operating Budget. The maximum annual revenue that could potentially be generated if all parking spaces are occupied by a permit holder is \$3,610.

## **DECISION HISTORY**

## **COMMENTS**

---

A request was received from the Ward Councillor, on behalf of area residents, to introduce the overnight on-street permit parking program on Newman Avenue, to accommodate their long-term parking needs without being subject to tagging by Toronto Police Service, Parking Enforcement Unit.

### **Existing Conditions**

Newman Avenue is characterized by the following conditions:

- It is a two-lane, north-south, local roadway
- It operates two-way traffic on a pavement width of approximately 7.3 metres
- There is no TTC service provided

The parking regulations on Newman Avenue, within the subject section are as follows:

#### **East side**

- No Parking May, July, September, and November

#### **West side**

- No parking January, February, March, April, June, August, October, and December

A map showing the location within Permit Area 9A is included in Attachment 1.

## Polling Results

In accordance with Municipal Code Chapter 925, a poll was conducted to determine if there is support for the installation of overnight on-street permit parking. Ballots were mailed out on June 27, 2024, to all residents on Newman Avenue, with the last day for filing a response being July 26, 2024.

A poll will be considered valid when at least 25 percent of the ballots mailed have been returned to the City Clerk. For Newman Avenue, 23 ballots were returned which represents a response rate of 45%. In order for a poll to be deemed positive, 50 percent plus one of returned ballots must be in favour of the request.

Table 1 summarizes the level of support for the installation of overnight on-street permit parking.

Table 1: Poll Results - Support for Permit Parking - Newman Avenue - Area 9A

Response Type	Number of ballots	Percentage
In Favour	17	74%
Opposed	6	26%
Spoiled Ballot	0	0%

As the majority of the ballots returned were in favour, the required minimum was met, and the poll was deemed to be positive, Transportation Services has no objection to the implementation of permit parking on Newman Avenue within Permit Area 9A.

The Ward Councillor has been advised of the recommendation in this report.
