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2025 OPERATING BUDGET BRIEFING NOTE Number of Full-time Equivalents within Transit Expansion Allocated to Each Transit Program

Issue/Background:

- On January 15, 2025, the Budget Committee requested the Executive Director, Transit Expansion to prepare a Briefing Note on the number of Full-time Equivalents (FTEs) within Transit Expansion, allocated to each transit project. This Briefing Note responds to the Committee's request.
- Table 1 below outlines the breakdown of the seventy (70) full-time equivalents within Transit Expansion allocated by transit program as of December 31, 2024.

Key Points:

- The FTEs allocated to each program are primarily determined by the applicable Resource Agreement governing each transit program.
- The Administration and Support Program consisting of the Finance and Business Support group and the Program Planning Groups are divisional resources required to administer the delivery of the program and to manage the City's interests in the delivery of transit expansion.
- Seven (7) new capital delivery positions are proposed in 2025 to sustain and expand Transit Expansion's capital delivery and provincial transit priorities projects, with full recovery from the 2025 Capital Budget, for a total of 77 FTEs.

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
