Re: Democratic freedom to protest in Toronto

I am writing to express my concern to the proposed 'Bubble zones' bylaw currently before Toronto City Council, which could limit our Canadian Charter-protected rights. I respectfully urge council to vote against it.

The right to freedom of expression and peaceful assembly is enshrined in Canada's Charter of Rights and Freedoms. This ensures that everyone's voices can be heard in a free and fair democracy. In a time where we are standing up for Canada's sovereignty, we must preserve the fundamental freedoms of Canada's democracy.
