Comments:

My comments relate to the need for indoor air quality to be considered as part of development of an Accessibility and Inclusion Handbook for event organizers. I am speaking as a researcher in long COVID at University of Toronto. Indoor air quality is an accessibility issue as poor indoor air quality is associated with increased transmission of viruses like COVID-19, which can result in disabling conditions such as long COVID. According to the government of Canada, the risk is amplified in crowded indoor event settings, especially where singing/shouting are taking place (1). In order for a handbook on accessibility of events to address the stated purpose, it must address indoor air quality and disease transmission. These impacts are also known to disproportionately impact marginalised groups, compounding the urgency for addressing this matter (2).
