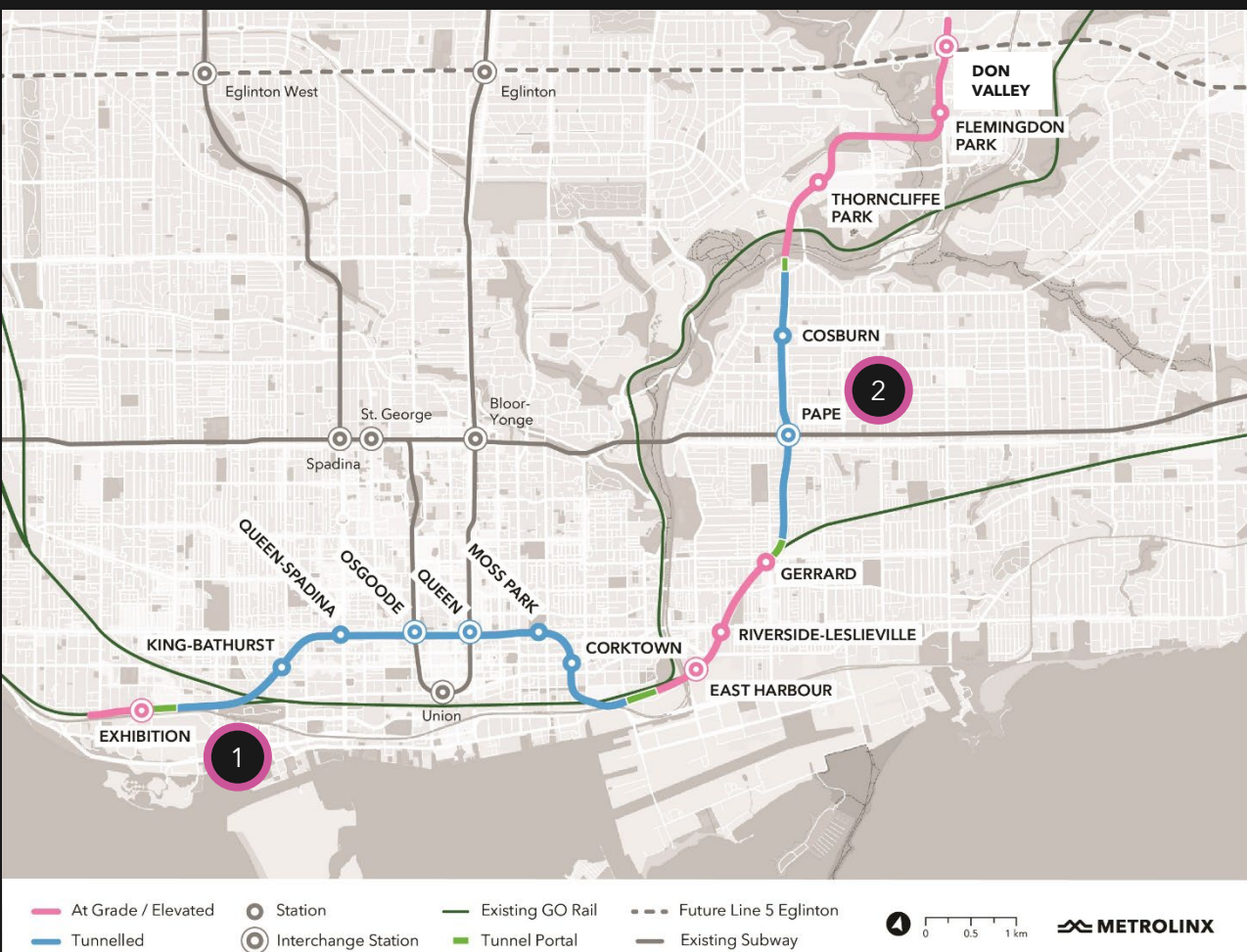

15 stations



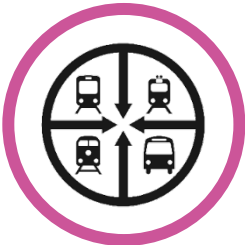
As frequent as every 90 seconds during rush hour



227,500 more people within walking distance to transit



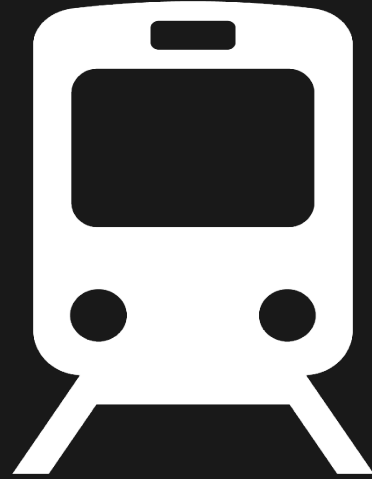
388,000 daily boardings

Up to 47,000 more jobs accessible in 45 minutes or less, on average

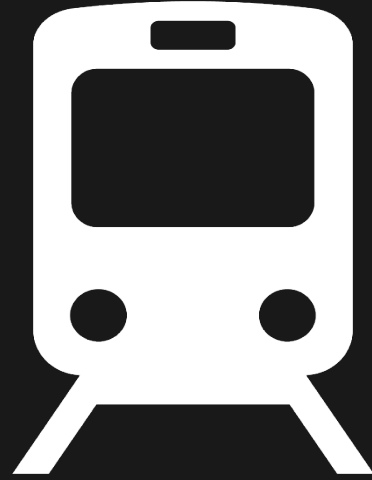


Exhibition Station Early Works Update

EARLY WORKS PROGRESS UPDATE

- Early Works construction is near completion. The work has significantly progressed over the past year and is about 95% complete, with only minor works pending completion. Major milestones include:
 - **New station entrance** successfully opened;
 - **Temporary pedestrian** completed in April 2024 and was opened last summer for special events;
 - Relocating and **extending the GO station south platform to** accommodate a 12-car GO train;
 - Removal of the existing north platform.

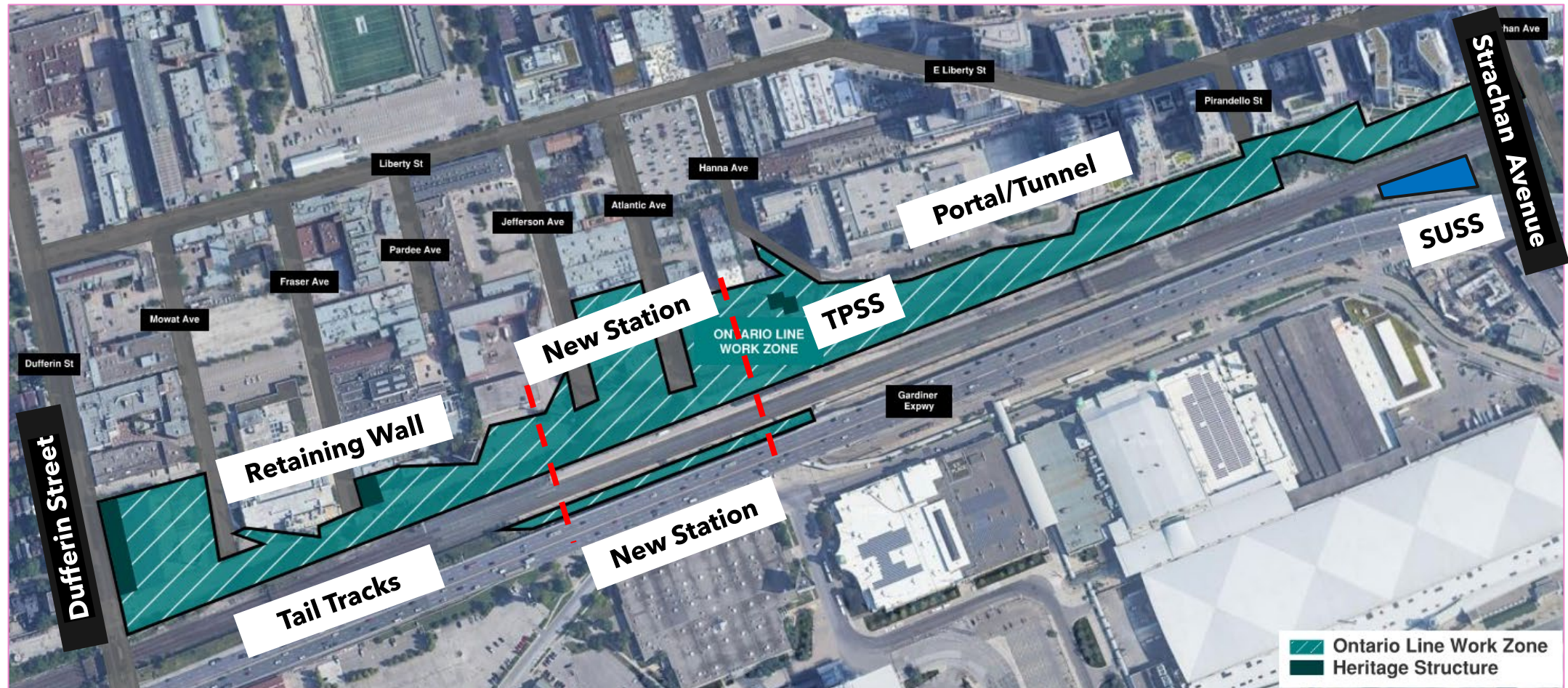




Exhibition Station and Ontario Line Construction Update

EARLY WORKS PROGRESS UPDATE

The linear construction work zones are currently **parallel to the GO train tracks** and **within the railway corridor**.



The following Exhibition area construction activities have significantly advanced :

- **Ontario Line Portal and TBM Lunch Site preparation**
- **TPSS (Traction Power Substation)**
- **Island Platform**
- **North Entrance Headhouse**



OVERALL PROGRESS UPDATE & UPCOMING WORK

- The Ontario Transit Group construction has significantly advance all of downtown Toronto, with station mining and excavation starting at nearly all six stations.
- Tunnel boring machine (TBM) operations for the Ontario Line south segment are scheduled to begin in 2026, launching from the portal located just west of Exhibition Station.
- Planning for the Metrolinx Ontario Place Connection were reset in 2024 to better align with Infrastructure Ontario and Exhibition Place's on-going master plan exercise.
