From **June 11 to July 19, 2026**, the eyes of the world will be on FIFA World Cup 26[™] and Toronto.

Toronto will stage six matches at Toronto Stadium (BMO Field), kicking off on June 12, 2026, with Canada's Men's National Team's opening match.

This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for Toronto to elevate its profile locally and globally, celebrating the strength of our diversity.

The *World in a City* will be a rallying cry for community to gather, to welcome the world and cheer loudly for those on the soccer pitch.







Traffic Management Strategies

Traffic Monitoring & Regulation

- Active Traffic Monitoring: Utilize City and Provincial traffic monitoring systems (TOC, RESCU, CRCTMC) to detect and mitigate incidents, with resources deployed to key corridors.
- Signal Timing Modifications: Adjust signal timings to prioritize event-related traffic and maintain flow, including temporary "green flush" measures.
- Traffic Regulation Modifications: Implement turning restrictions near venues to prevent neighborhood infiltration and improve traffic flow.

Guidance & Permits

- Advance Information and Signage: Use VMS, PVMS, and static signage to provide clear guidance and promote alternative routes.
- Authorized Vehicle Permits: Issue permits to FIFA-authorized vehicles for easy identification and streamlined access.
- Traffic Filtration Zones: Designate and signpost zones for Local Traffic and FIFA Authorized vehicles, with dedicated lanes near the stadium.

Sustainability Focus

• Transportation Demand Management: Encourage sustainable travel modes and timing adjustments to reduce vehicular demand .

Traffic Management Strategies

Key Support Strategies

- Limiting Construction: Suspend construction projects on key routes during critical event periods.
- Detailed Traffic Control Plans: Develop plans outlining barriers, restrictions, and signage placements.

Parking & Enforcement

- Restriction of On -Street Parking: Prohibit parking along major routes on match days, with enforcement to clear illegal vehicles.
- Limiting Parking Near Stadium: Restrict public parking in areas surrounding the stadium to reduce congestion and local impact.
- Enforcement of Traffic Regulations: Deploy enforcement teams and tow trucks for rapid response to violations and incidents

Highway & Expressway Measures

- Police Patrolling: Regular patrols on the Gardiner Expressway to prevent illegal stops for stadium views.
- Expressway/Highway Volume Control: Temporary ramp closures to manage traffic volume during peak times .
