**Re:** Warnica Avenue and Brawley Avenue – Motion Memorandum  
**Wards:** Ward 3, Etobicoke-Lakeshore

Transportation Services has been requested by a local councillor to provide recommended wording for recommendations they plan to present in a motion to Etobicoke York Community Council. Staff request that this memorandum accompany the member's submission.

### Summary

- Staff **support** the draft recommendations provided below
- Staff **do not support** the draft recommendations provided below
- Staff do not have sufficient data and/or time to determine if the draft recommendations provided below can be supported by staff, at this time.

### Draft Recommendation

1. *Etobicoke York Community Council authorize all-way compulsory stop control at the intersection of Warnica Avenue and Brawley Avenue.*

Traffic Operations conducted an all-way stop study at this intersection in September 2022, in which the traffic volumes recorded over a 4-hour study did not satisfy the all-way stop warrant. The average vehicle volume was recorded as 121 (required 250), the vehicle/pedestrian volume crossing the major road was 56 (required 100) and the volume split was recorded as 62/38. During our study an average of 14 pedestrians were recorded crossing Warnica Avenue near Brawley Avenue. The pedestrian volumes were factored by 2, consistent with the approved all-way stop warrant.

Recent development on The Queensway at Brawley Avenue/Zorra Avenue may have increased traffic/pedestrian volumes in the subject intersection. However, staff have not been able to complete updated studies at this time. Staff would anticipate traffic volumes would still fail to satisfy the minimum all-way stop requirements.

**Cost**

Staff have not been able to develop engineering estimates for this work but based on previous experience and similar work in the past, we expect the costs associated with approving the draft recommendations below will be approximately \$700.00. As this work was not anticipated, it has not been specifically included in any approved budgets. Completion of the work would be subject to availability and competing priorities within future Transportation Services Operating OR Capital Budgets, unless a specific funding source is identified by the councillor and approved by Etobicoke York Community Council.
