

Accessible Parking Spaces - October 2025

SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter that Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

Transportation Services is requesting approval for the installation and removal of on-street accessible parking spaces for persons with disabilities.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Director, Enforcement and Street Management, Transportation Services recommends that:

1. Etobicoke York Community Council authorize the installation and removal of on-street accessible parking spaces at the locations identified in Attachment 1 attached to the report dated October 2025 from the Director, Enforcement and Street Management, Transportation Services.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The signage costs associated with the proposed installation and removal of accessible parking spaces is approximately \$3,500. Funding is available within the Transportation Services 2025 Operating Budget.

DECISION HISTORY

This report addresses a new initiative.

COMMENTS

Transportation Services provides designated on-street accessible parking as a convenience for people with disabilities and/or those who transport them, making it easier for them to find available parking as near as possible to their places of residence or intended destinations and reducing walking distance.

Designated on-street accessible parking spaces are not for the exclusive use of any one resident. Any person with a valid Accessible Parking Permit issued by the Ministry of Transportation of Ontario (MTO) may park in any designated on-street accessible parking space. Designated on-street accessible parking spaces may be relocated for technical or operational reasons, if deemed necessary by the City.

Delays in installing on-street accessible parking spaces may create hardships for the applicants. Timely removal of a designated on-street accessible parking space when it is no longer needed, for instance when the resident moves or is no longer eligible, aids in maximizing available on-street parking for other residents/motorists.

To be eligible for on-street accessible parking, applicants must hold a valid Accessible Parking Permit, issued by the MTO. Staff have determined that the installation/removal of on-street accessible parking spaces, as listed in Attachment 1, is feasible as the requirements are met and each designated space will not result in the loss of more than one on-street parking space for general use.

Attachment 1: On-street Accessible Parking Spaces to be Installed/Removed

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Table 1: On-street Accessible Parking Spaces to be installed

Ward	Location
5	Batavia Avenue, east side, between a point 142.9 metres south of Pritchard Avenue and a point 5.5 metres further south, from December 1 of one year to March 31 of the next following year, inclusive, and from the 16th day to the last day of each month from April 1 to November 30th, inclusive.
5	Batavia Avenue, west side, between a point 143.3 metres south of Pritchard Avenue and a point 5.5 metres further south, from the 1st day to the 15th day of each month from April 1 to November 30, inclusive.
5	Batavia Avenue, east side, between a point 37.5 metres south of Pritchard Avenue and a point 5.5 metres further south, from December 1 of one year to March 31 of the next following year, inclusive, and from the last day of each month from April 1 to November 30th, inclusive.
5	Batavia Avenue, west side, between a point 30.5 metres south of Pritchard Avenue and a point 5.5 metres further south, from the 1st day to the 15th day of each month from April 1 to November 30, inclusive.
5	Bartonville Avenue West, south side, between a point 20 metres west of Bala Avenue, and a point 5.5 metre further west.
5	Homer Avenue, north side, between a point 52.9 metres west of Rockcliffe Boulevard and a point 5.5 metres further west
5	Barr Avenue, north side between a point 15 metres east of Weston Road and a point 5.5 metres further east.
5	Trowell Avenue, south side between a point 64.8 metres west of Silverthorn Avenue and a point 5.5 metres further west.

3	Fifteenth Street, east side, between a point 84 metres north of Lake Shore Boulevard West and a point 5.5 metres further north.
