We are a local group of residents who formed specifically to support the development of the Etobicoke Greenway Trail. We are committed to the advancement of this project as a safe, connected, and accessible active transportation corridor, one that promotes community health, equity, and sustainable mobility.

We support Councillor Holyday’s recommendation for a report back with proposed next steps to advance this project and we look forward to being part of the continued conversation.

As a community group, we have participated in multiple local events this year and heard overwhelmingly positive feedback from residents. The Etobicoke Greenway is seen as a much-needed addition to our local trail network, with strong interest in a safe, accessible, and connected route that links multiple neighbourhoods, schools, and key transit infrastructure—including the Kipling Transit Hub.

Residents are excited about the potential of this trail to enhance local mobility, support active transportation, and provide new recreational opportunities. In addition to the trail surface itself, the community has consistently emphasized the importance of including the proper amenities and infrastructure to make the trail fully accessible and safe for all users.

This includes:

- **Adequate lighting**
- **Seating and rest areas**
- **Accessible pathway design**
- **Clear signage and wayfinding**

We are encouraged by the collaboration between Hydro One and the City and see this as a unique legacy opportunity to deliver a high-impact public asset.

We respectfully urge Council to support the motion to enable Parks & Recreation to advance the agreement needed to proceed into the design phase.

Thank you for your leadership and for supporting meaningful investments in active

transportation and equitable access to green space in Etobicoke.
