

City of Toronto Act, 2006 – Public Notice

Toronto City Council will be considering recommendations to

Introduce new fees for requesting Toronto Water sewer data and for the time taken for City staff to review wastewater energy program applications. These fees are intended to cover all City costs on a cost recovery basis. The City's wastewater energy program is an important initiative that will help achieve TransformTO's goal of sourcing 50% of community-wide energy from renewable sources by 2030.

The Infrastructure and Environment Committee will make recommendations to City Council, and City Council will decide on the matter at its meeting on March 26, 27 and 28 2025.
