

## Public Notice

### **Request for Temporary Delegated to the General Manager, Transportation Service, to Approve Temporary Road Closures Up To and Including 365 Consecutive Days for TTC Traction Power Upgrade Projects**

Toronto City Council will be considering recommendations to pass a by-law to amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 937, Temporary Closing of Highways Chapter 27, Council Procedures in order to authorize the General Manager, Transportation Services to temporarily close to pedestrian and vehicular traffic highways or portions of highways for a period up to and including 365 consecutive days, but:

1. ending no later than December 31, 2026, inclusive, as required for the purpose of the TTC's Easier Access Phase Three Projects,
2. ending no later than December 31, 2032, inclusive, as required for the purpose of the TTC's Traction Power Upgrade Projects.

It is proposed that the by-law be adopted at the Council meeting to be held on April 23, 24 and 25, 2025 or at a subsequent meeting.

The report from the General Manager, Transportation Services, titled "Request for Temporary Delegation to the General Manager, Transportation Services, to Approve Temporary Road Closures Up To and Including 365 Consecutive Days for TTC Traction Power Upgrade Projects" has the following recommendations:

1. For the Easier Access Projects, City Council amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 937, Temporary Closing of Highways, to delegate to the General Manager, Transportation Services, until December 31, 2026, inclusive, the authority to temporarily close to vehicular and pedestrian traffic any highway or portion of highway for a period up to 365 consecutive days but ending no later than December 31, 2026, inclusive, with the exception of those highways listed in Section 937-4 of Code Chapter 937, as required for the purpose of construction, and City Council exempt the General Manager of Transportation Services, in carrying out this delegated authority from Section 937-5 of Chapter 937, that being the requirement to notify the local Ward Councillor of the pending closure and the requirement to report on the proposed closure if so requested by the local Ward Councillor.
2. For the Traction Power Upgrade Projects, City Council amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 937, Temporary Closing of Highways, to delegate to the General Manager, Transportation Services, until December 31, 2032, inclusive, the authority to temporarily close to vehicular and pedestrian traffic any highway or portion of highway for a period up to 365 consecutive days but ending no later than December 31, 2032, inclusive, with the exception of those highways listed in Section 937-4 of Code Chapter 937, as required for the purpose of construction, and City Council exempt the General Manager of Transportation Services, in carrying out this delegated authority from Section 937-5 of Chapter 937, that being the requirement to notify the local Ward Councillor of the pending closure and the requirement to report on the proposed closure if so requested by the local Ward Councillor.
3. City Council amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 27, Council Procedures, to provide that the current delegation to Community Council to temporarily close public lanes or public alleys, local roads, collector roads, and minor arterial roads does not

include closures delegated to the General Manager, Transportation Services, in carrying out the authority in Parts 1 and 2.

At its meeting to be held virtually and in-person on April 9, 2025, at 9:30 a.m. or as soon as possible thereafter, the Infrastructure and Environment Committee of Toronto City Council will hear in person, video conference, or by his or her counsel, agent or solicitor, any person who wishes to speak to the matter.
