## RE: <u>IE24.7</u> Long term Residual Waste Management Work Plan, IEC <u>26Sep25</u> mtg

I am writing as an individual Toronto resident to show support to you today to *delay* a decision on waste to energy, & *amend* the item to recommend Council order that SWMS staff do the following\* *instead*.

I echo concerns raised by the Toronto Environmental Alliance (TEA), & Environmental Defence Canada. The City's survey was inaccurate & misleading. I oppose "waste-to-energy" as an option for managing Toronto's residual waste. It:

- is an environmentally un-sound method for disposing of municipal waste; is too expensive & toxic a form of disposal or energy; destroys resources in direct opposition to zero waste & a circular economy; requires perpetual waste generation to justify the cost; creates toxic environments & is unjust it doesn't belong in your or anyone's backyard & there's significant room for more, better waste reduction & reuse in Toronto instead.
- \*1. Prioritize operating in alignment with Board of Health's Strategic Plan (<u>HL26.2</u>) including for example: (i.) "Strengthen health protection, disease prevention..." which includes "*Prevent* Cancer" (<u>HL17.1</u>) & (<u>HL23.2</u>); & (ii.) "Promote health & well-being across the lifespan" which includes "*noise*" reduction.
- 2. Prioritize *reducing* the number of trucks on the road to help reduce noise.
- 3. Survey all wildlife orgs to determine the quantity of wildlife impacted by vehicles/trucks.
- 4. Prioritize *reducing* pollution & *refraining* from adding to it. There is too much already.
- 5. Provide a *fulsome* report on the health & environmental impacts of "waste to energy".
- 6. *Identify* more, better alternatives than proceeding with thermal waste treatment.
- 7. Follow through on Council's aspirational zero waste goal & commitments to create a circular economy & take more action on the climate crisis.
- 8. *Incentivize, promote & support financially & with space:* decentralized reduce, reuse, repair, share & compost hubs in every neighbourhood; small local businesses & organizations involved in waste reduction & reuse; & maintenance staff, property managers & 3Rs Ambassadors at residential & multi-residential properties.
- 9. Ban organics & textiles from landfill & incineration.
- 10. Recommend Council create 25K permanently deeply affordable adequate supportive accessible housing units per year for each of the next 5 yrs to clear the housing waitlist backlog to fulfill the Right to Housing & allow all people in Toronto equitable access to meaningfully participate in Toronto's circular economy & zero waste goals.
