Energy Use in Canada

15% Transportation – 20% Heat, Light and Cool – 45% Make Stuff – then throw out

Waste Diversion

With Producer Responsibility Organization (PRO) taking over the collection of recyclables in Toronto you're going to have an untold number of Staff and many Millions of \$'s come free.
