Marg also led the expansion of The Beach BIA through to Coxwell to serve the full business community.

As a single parent and an independent spirit, Marg was intense, strong-willed, and determined. She was adventurous and loved to travel, cared deeply about people, and had legendary culinary talents. Her characteristic passion and resilience also defined her 18-year battle with cancer. She faced it head-on, refusing to back down, and she will be profoundly missed.
