Re: Elm Avenue, between Mount Pleasant Road and Sherbourne Street North  
- Traffic Calming Request – Motion Memorandum (Ward 11, University-Rosedale)

Transportation Services has been requested by the Ward 11 Councillor to provide wording for recommendations they plan to present to the September 18, 2025, Toronto and East York Community Council in lieu of a staff report. Staff request that this memorandum accompany the Councillor's letter.

## Draft Recommendations

1. *Toronto and East York Community Council authorize the installation of speed humps on Elm Avenue, between Mount Pleasant Road and Sherbourne Street North.*
2. *Toronto and East York Community Council direct the City Solicitor to prepare a by-law to alter the roadway for the installation of three speed humps on Elm Avenue, between Mount Pleasant Road and Sherbourne Street North, generally as shown on Attachment, Drawing TC-549 dated August 2025, attached to the report entitled "Traffic Calming (Speed Humps) – Elm Avenue" from the Director, Traffic Management, Transportation Services.*

Motorist speed and volume data was not collected, and staff have not evaluated the installation of traffic calming measures (speed humps) on this roadway.

## **Cost**

Staff have not been able to develop engineering estimates for this work but based on previous experience and similar work in the past, we expect the costs associated with approving the draft recommendations below will be approximately \$12,000.00. As this work was not anticipated, it has not been specifically included in any approved budgets. Completion of the work would be subject to availability and competing priorities within future Capital Budgets, unless a specific funding source is identified by the Councillor and approved by Toronto and East York Community Council.
