Re: Parking Amendments - Dentonia Park Avenue (Ward 19, Beaches - East York)

Transportation Services has been requested by the Ward 19 Councillor to provide recommended wording for recommendations they plan to present to the October 22, 2025, Toronto and East York Community Council. Staff request that this memorandum accompany the Councillor's letter.

Summary

Draft Recommendations:

1. *Toronto and East York Community Council authorize parking for a maximum period of one hour from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, on the north side of Dentonia Park Avenue, between Avonlea Boulevard and Sibley Avenue.*

In an effort to improve the current parking arrangements on Dentonia Park Avenue, residents have submitted a petition to the Ward Councillor's office, requesting that parking be limited to a maximum period of one hour on the north side of Dentonia Park Avenue, between Avonlea Boulevard and Sibley Avenue. The proposed parking amendment, which will be in effect during the weekday, daytime periods, will discourage long-term parking and increase parking turnover on this section of Dentonia Park Avenue. On-street permit parking holders will be exempted from the one-hour parking limit regulation. The maximum one-hour parking limit will impact residents' visitors, including guests, caretakers, service people, etc. As there is demonstrated community support, Transportation Services have no objections to the requested changes.

Financial Impact

Staff have not been able to develop engineering estimates for this work but based on previous experience and similar work in the past, we expect the costs associated with approving the draft recommendations below will be approximately \$500.00. As this work was not anticipated, it has not been specifically included in any approved budgets. Completion of the work would be subject to availability and competing priorities within future Transportation Services Operating, unless a specific funding source is identified by the councillor and approved by Toronto and East York Community Council.
