Re: TE23.12 - St. Clair Avenue West and Bathurst Street Planning Framework and Forest Hill Village Urban Design Guidelines Review South Forest Hill Residents Association

We represent the South Forest Hill Residents Association (the "SFHRA"), a group of residents who advocate for and support good development in South Forest Hill.

We understand that Council has directed staff to review and update the *St. Clair Avenue West and Bathurst Street Planning Framework (2019)* and *Forest Hill Village Urban Design Guidelines (2015)*, and staff are targeting to bring to Community Council a final version of a new *St Clair Avenue West, Bathurst Street and Forest Hill Village Planning Framework* in Q4 2025.

Our client supports the creation of updated development guidelines that both respond to and balance recent Provincial and City policy initiatives, including PMTSA policies and EHON policies, with the Official Plan objective that new development should respect the distinct character and context a neighbourhood. As staff acknowledge, the Forest Hill Village has a distinct 'small town character', while Spadina Road has a distinct 'main street character'. It is of utmost importance that this character be maintained in the context of allowing the creation of more housing. Part of this is the creation of an updated Public Realm Network Plan and the identification of defined character areas with associated protections built in.

It is also of utmost importance that the intensification that is permitted addresses the housing crisis that is driving these new policies. In other words, that the new units that are being built are meeting housing needs.

To reiterate, the SFHRA is not advocating for no development or non-intensification. Rather the SHFRA is advocating for development that fits within the existing neighborhood, protects the public realm, does not threaten to destabilize the Forest Hill





Village or the broader Forest Hill area with over-development, and addresses the housing crisis.

The SFHRA requests that it be included in any future community consultations for this study / review, and requests to be kept updated on the progress of this study / review. Notice should be sent to:
