A Tarrif on our neighbourhood

Turning a residential street into a service alley.



The Tariff

Residents of Foxbar Road will pay this hidden tariff every day:

- Traffic & safety risks (200+ vehicles, trucks, daycare, amazon deliveries, ubers, retail etc.)
- Wind & shadows (engineer-approved, resident-dangerous)
- Affordability gap, because IZ zoning does not apply it is a purpose-built luxury rental tower.
- City/Taxpayers costs (roads, TTC, schools, EMS, infrastructure)

100 Year lease.

Profits constantly flow to the developer and pension funds.

Foxbar as a Service Alley

All vehicle access is forced through Foxbar Road:

- Parking garage (200 vehicles)
- Loading trucks
- Garbage collection
- Daycare drop-off and pick-up
- Couriers, Amazon Deliveries, Uber etc.
- Retail

Foxbar becomes a permanent service alley for a 49-storey tower.

Avenue Road Contradiction


The City says Avenue Road access is against policy.


But in reality:

- Substantially all Towers fronting on Avenue Road use it for entrance/egress.
- Avenue Road is designed for traffic. Avenue Road is SIX lanes south of St. Clair and SEVEN lanes north of St. Clair.
- Foxbar is a narrow, predominantly one-way, SINGLE LANE winding residential street, with extremely restricted sightlines.
- Avenue Road is the logical, safest and least impactful entrance location.
