I understand that the City Clerk has opted not to publish my comments at this time. I am formally requesting that this decision be reconsidered, in the interest of transparency and public participation in the democratic process.

The decision to withhold public submissions from view is deeply concerning. At best, it undermines the spirit of democratic transparency. At worst, it has the appearance of a cover-up - one that sends a troubling message to residents: that elected officials can act without consequence, and that the mechanisms meant to hold them accountable can simply be switched off when inconvenient.

This kind of opacity does not go unnoticed. It erodes public trust and reinforces the perception that City Hall operates for the benefit of those in power, not the citizens it was elected to serve.

If residents cannot see that their voices are being heard and recorded, why would they believe the process is fair at all?

I ask that my submission be published and accessible alongside all other submissions on the agenda item page. Transparency is not optional - it is the foundation of accountable governance.
