Evictions disproportionately impact Black tenants and families, and often occur without adequate supports, legal representation, or pathways back into stable housing. The lack of disaggregated race-based data further limits transparency and accountability.

A temporary eviction moratorium is a necessary step to prevent further harm while systemic solutions are developed, including improved data collection, tenant supports, and the reinstatement of the Black Tenant Advisory Committee.
