IE27.11 – Finch West Goods Movement Study

The Toronto Industry Network (TIN) was established in 2002 to provide a voice for Toronto's manufacturers at City Hall and Queen's Park. Our members produce paper and food products, silicone, chemicals, welding equipment, vaccines, concrete, petroleum products, plastic pipe, fibreglass insulation, road building materials, gelatin, etc. Many of these products are used here in Toronto or are exported, creating wealth for the city.

TIN wishes to support the three recommendations from the General Manager, Transportation Services, that have been put forward for the Committee's consideration. The ability to transport both inputs and finished goods is very important to manufacturers, and TIN has taken an active interest in the Finch West corridor on previous occasions. We would ask, however, that we have an opportunity to be consulted and provide input as this work proceeds, given our past experience with this issue and its relevance to our members.
