The ravine strategy, while good, could be even better. Please make it illegal to build on or near a ravine. Ravines should have a legal status as a place that has water and or a certain number of trees. It should be made illegal to cut more than a certain number of trees or block a waterway.

Wildlife protection is not listed as part of the ravine strategy. These ravines are homes and highways for wildlife, yet building on them, constant disruptive behaviour and litter from humans and dogs harms or even kills wildlife, especially during nesting season.
