**Re: Draycott Drive – Speed Limit Reduction | Motion Memorandum**

Transportation Services has been requested by a local councillor to provide recommended wording for recommendations they plan to present in a motion to North York Community Council. Staff request that this memorandum accompany the member's submission.

### **Summary**

- Staff **do not have sufficient data and/or time to determine if the draft recommendations provided below can be supported by staff, at this time.**

### Draft Recommendations:

1. North York Community Council reduce the speed limit from 50 km/h to 40 km/h on Draycott Drive, between Sloane Avenue and Victoria Park Avenue.

Draycott Drive is an 8.5-metre-wide local roadway without sidewalks. Sloane Public School is located on the west side of the intersection of Draycott Drive and Sloane Avenue. There is no TTC service on Draycott Drive. The existing speed limit on Draycott Drive is 50 km/h. The Vision Zero supported and City Council endorsed speed limit on local streets is 30 km/h.

### **Cost**

Staff have not been able to develop engineering estimates for this work but based on previous experience and similar work in the past, we expect the costs associated with approving the draft recommendation will be approximately \$500. As this work was not anticipated, it has not been specifically included in any approved budgets. Completion of the work would be subject to availability and competing priorities within future Transportation Services Operating Budget, unless a specific funding source is identified by the Councillor and approved by North York Community Council
