Fondly known as the *Queen of the Lake*, she was happiest at her cottage surrounded by family, her daughters Rachel and Clare; her son-in-law Michael; and her grandchildren Noah, Leo, Sasha, Joshua, and Sofia, sharing time swimming, hiking, enjoying meals on the Muskoka porch, and reading by the dock.
