Born in Toronto, Mary Anne was raised and spent most of her life in the Baby Point neighbourhood she loved so dearly. She worked tirelessly and fearlessly to advocate for Baby Point's preservation through designation. But this was just one of the causes that she held dear to heart. She dedicated much of her time and energy as Chair and Co-Founder of the St. Joe's Plate, a charity supporting young adult mental health, and board member of YouthLink.
