Re: Main Street – Parking Amendments – Re-opening item 2026.TE32.49
(Ward 19, Beaches-East York)

Transportation Services is requesting that the Ward 19 Councillor re-open Item 2026.TE32.49, titled “Main Street – Parking Amendments”, at the May 28, 2026, meeting of Toronto and East York Community Council. The re-opening is necessary to correct an administrative error that excluded a street name from one of the recommendations. Staff request that this memorandum accompany the Councillor’s letter.

This memorandum is about a matter that Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

Draft Recommendations

1. *Toronto and East York Community Council re-open Item 2026.TE32.49, titled "Main Street - Parking Amendments", with respect to Part 3 of the decision of Toronto and East York Community Council.*
2. *Toronto and East York Community Council delete Part 3 of its decision on Item 2026.TE32.49 and adopt the following:*
 1. *Toronto and East York Community Council amend the existing 1-hour parking regulation in effect from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. daily, on the north and west side of Stephenson Avenue between Main Street and Morton Road, to be in effect on the north side of Stephenson Avenue between Morton Road and the laneway west of Main Street, north of Stephenson Avenue.*

At its meeting on April 30, 2026, Toronto and East York Community Council adopted Item 2026.TE32.49, titled ‘Main Street – Parking Amendments,’ approving amendments

to parking regulations on Main Street and Stephenson Avenue ([Agenda-item History 2026.TE32.49](#))

Transportation Services staff have since identified that a street name was inadvertently excluded from one of the recommendations. As the original approval occurred less than one year ago, Council procedures require that the previously approved item be re-opened and amended to correct the error.
