Re: Shaftesbury Avenue - Parking Amendments (Ward 11, University-Rosedale)

Transportation Services has been requested by the Ward 11 Councillor to provide recommended wording for recommendations they plan to present to the July 8-9, 2026, Toronto and East York Community Council. Staff request that this memorandum accompany the Councillor's letter.

This memorandum is about a matter that Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

## Draft Recommendation

*1. Toronto and East York Community Council rescind the existing maximum one-hour parking regulation in effect from 9:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday to Saturday, on the north side of Shaftesbury Avenue, between Summerhill Avenue and a point 91.4 metres east of Yonge Street.*

During the course of a recent by-law review on Shaftesbury Avenue, staff noted inconsistencies between the by-lawed parking regulations and the posted signage. Temporary parking by-law changes were recently implemented on Shaftesbury Avenue to accommodate construction staging, which had recently concluded. During the process of reinstating the pre-existing parking by-law conditions, staff noted there is a by-lawed one-hour time limit parking regulation on the north side that has not been signed. As the Councillor does not wish for this regulation to be re-instated, it needs to be rescinded. Staff have no objections to this change, which will allow for the daytime three-hour time limit parking to continue.
