

## **Naming of a Public Lane located east of Logan Avenue, west of Morse Street**

### **SUMMARY**

---

This report recommends that the name "Sunday Mews" be approved to identify the naming of a Public Lane located east of Logan Avenue, west of Morse Street.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

---

Engineering and Construction Services recommends that Toronto and East York Community Council:

1. Approve the name "Sunday Mews" for the naming of a Public Lane located east of Logan Avenue, west of Morse Street.

### **FINANCIAL IMPACT**

---

The cost to install street name signage is approximately \$600.00 and is included within the Transportation Services Division's approved 2026 Operating Budget.

### **DECISION HISTORY**

---

This is the first time that this issue is before Community Council.

## COMMENTS

---

An application was received on September 22 2025, from a resident requesting to name the public lane located east of Logan Avenue, west of Morse Street, as “Sunday Mews” honouring the bright, idyllic days of rest shared with family and friends; baking bread, strolling along tree-lined paths, and enjoying the quiet charm of Leslieville.

The following background and rationale were provided by the applicant:

### **Sunday Mews**

*The proposal to name the unnamed laneway to “Sunday Mews” encapsulates the laid-back, slower-paced, family-oriented character of Leslieville: a neighbourhood dotted with local coffee shops, cozy brunch spots, and boutique thrift stops. Evoking connotations of restful pauses, kindred moments and communal bonds, “Sunday” also gently nods to Toronto’s religious roots.*

*“Mews” refers to multi-use lanes that accommodate both vehicles and homes – just like this lane does today.*

The proposed name has been circulated for comment and is acceptable to Toronto Police Service, Toronto Fire Services, and Toronto Paramedic Services.

Councillor Paula Fletcher, Ward 14 Toronto-Danforth, supports this naming.

Community support was demonstrated with a petition of signatures from the property owners abutting the lane and the local community.

Community Councils have delegated authority to decide street naming matters which comply with the City of Toronto Street Naming Policy.

The lane is shown as PART 1 on Attachment No.1 Sketch No. PS-2026-016.

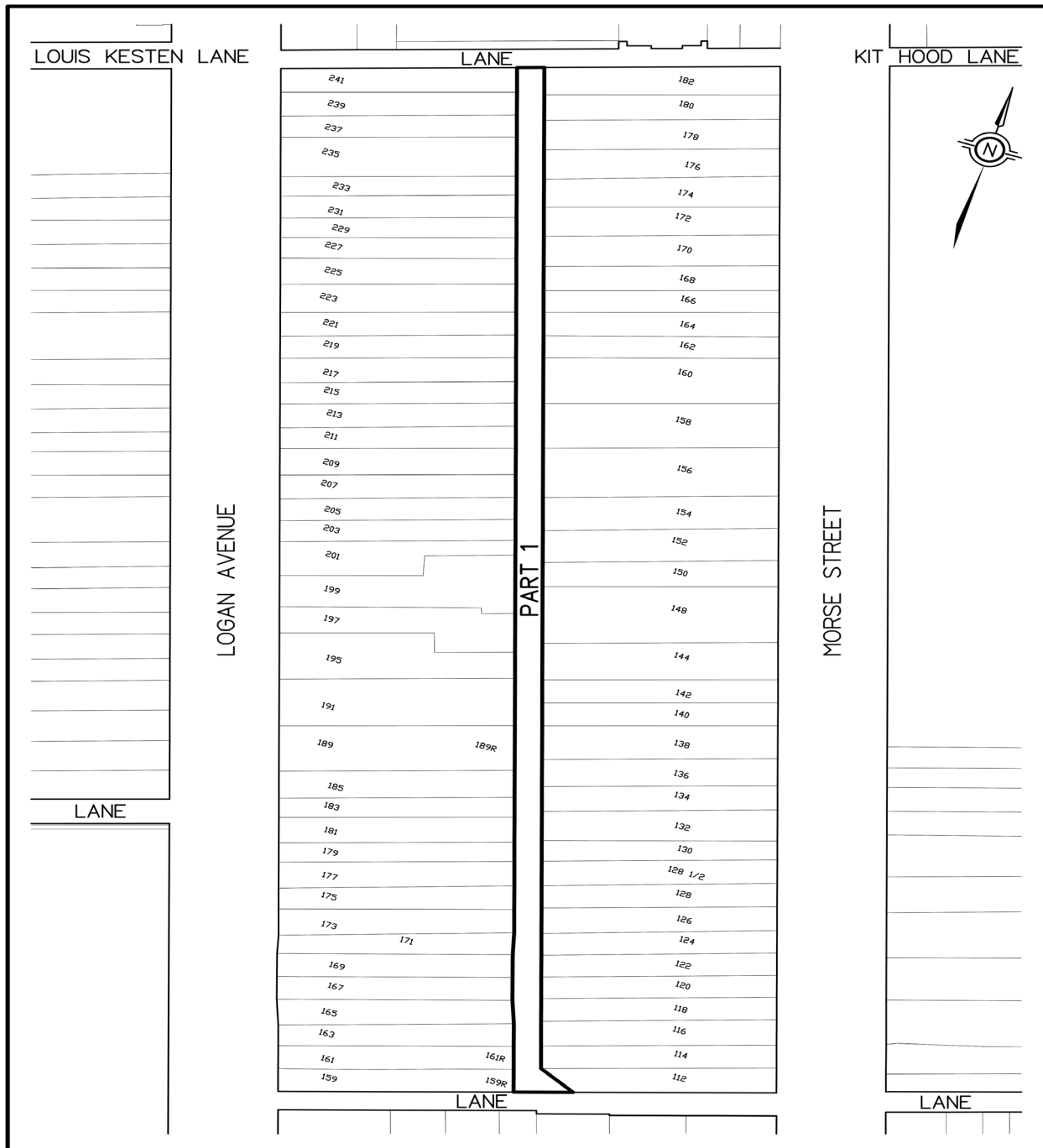
