	<ul> <li>Open Data</li> <li>Information &amp; Technology Division and City Clerk's Office are partnering to revise the governance model and develop a three-year work plan.</li> <li>The Open Data Committee will be bringing the model and plan to the Committee for review.</li> </ul>
Rob Meikle / Nancy Isozaki	Rob Meikle provided an update on the Email Replacement Project. Nancy Isozaki outlined the proposed approach to manage email migration volumes by user categories.  • The project objective is to migration 22,500+ users from GroupWise to Outlook from March to August 2015.  • The project is on track with over 6,500 users migrated to date.  • With the help of the Division Leads, Divisions are encouraged to have their staff take advantage of the available multi-medium training options.  • The migration is an opportunity for users to "clean up" their mailboxes and practice good record keeping.  • Pre- and Post-migration activities are very crucial in a user's migration experience.  • Nancy outlined how the use of various user categories could reduce the volume of email to be migrated to Outlook. (See attached presentations)  • Moving forward, the retention period will be "rolling window" depending on the user category. The future Enterprise Document & Records Management Solution will be used to store business records instead of keeping them in Outlook.  • In the future, email boxes may be limited in size as is the industry practice.

Mayor's Declaration	John Jones	<ul> <li>John Jones advised that a briefing note has been written requesting the Mayor to make an Open Government Declaration. The briefing note is under review with the City Clerk and Director, Strategic Communications.</li> <li>The City of Toronto is the only large municipality that has not made such declaration.</li> <li>Some municipalities have had the declaration made by the Mayor or Council.</li> <li>With Open Government part of the Council Strategic Plan and one of the specific Strategic Actions, it's not necessary to have Open Government declared by Council again, just the Mayor. How to approach the Mayor and when will be discussed further with the City Clerk's Office, Strategic Communications and the City Manager's Office.</li> </ul>
Common Data Elements Standards for City Forms	Michelle Jongman / John Jones	Members should review the briefing note and presentation on the Common Data Elements Standards for City Forms in particular and provide feedback.  Action Item:  • Members to forward comments, to John Jones by May 11, 2015. And to endorse the Standard if in agreement.
IT Acceptable Use Policy	Grant Coffey and Fiona Murray	<ul> <li>Grant and Fiona provided an update on the draft IT Acceptable Use Policy.</li> <li>This will be a more concise policy that will consolidate a number of technology specific policies and will retire various others. (i.e. mobile, email).</li> <li>The draft is under review of Information &amp; Technology Division, City Clerk's Office, Human Resources, Legal Services, and City Manager's Office. It was presented at (FACT) Finance Administration Coordination Team for their input.</li> <li>There was discussion about including what constitutes personal/private usage. It was agreed that it's up to division management to monitor personal/private usage as it relates to operational needs.</li> <li>The Committee recommended the insertion of "assess" for clause 8.1.1.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>The analysis indicated the more open government awareness and training is necessary. The Open Government Workshops should leverage this information to bring awareness to Open Government.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>The Committee suggested that the same survey be done in two years from now using the 2015 results as a baseline.</li> </ul>
