HOURS OF WORK AND OVERTIME:

(A) For Building Construction (Operating Engineers)

Eight (8) hours/day, 40 hours/week, Monday to Friday, inclusive, time and one-half of the regular day shift rate shall be paid for the first hour of overtime; all work in excess of hours noted & Saturday, Sunday and Holidays, double the regular day shift rate.

(B) Excavations, Site Preparation, Sewers and Watermains.

Site preparation shall mean the excavating of ground to sub-grade level and shall not include pile-driving, drilling, boring ductwork or tunnel work.

Ten (10) hours/day, 50 hours/week, Monday to Friday inclusive.

IRON WORKERS:

(Structural, architectural): includes Rivetters, Riggers, Heaters, Sash Erectors and Machinery Movers.

* <u>FRINGE BENEFITS</u>: "Fringe Benefits" shall include such benefits as company pension plans, apprenticeship training, extended health care benefits, dental and prescription drugs, etc. It does **NOT** include payroll burden deductions such as C.P.P., E.H.T., W.S.I.B., E.I.C., etc.

* VACATION AND HOLIDAY PAY:

For contractors that do not offer "fringe benefits" to their workers, the fringe benefits hourly rate shall be added to the hourly or weekly rate as shown above.

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
