#### 3. Jurisdiction and their Scope

- The *Planning Act*
- Section 45 (12) delivers six distinct authorizations of jurisdiction under s. 45
- Section 53 (14), (19) and (27) deliver three consent-related areas of jurisdiction.
  - (<u>Underlining</u> emphasizes statutory tests; \* denotes no direction given)
  - S. 45(1) –authorize variances to s. 34 and s.38 by-laws for land, building or structure that are <u>minor, desirable for the</u> <u>appropriate development or use, and if general intent and purpose of the by-law and official plan are maintained (the</u> 'Four Tests').
  - 2) S. 45(2) (a) (i) *enlargement or extension* of a building or structure of a continuing legal non-conforming use\*, or
  - 3) for the *enlargement or extension of* a building or structure for a use that is <u>similar or more compatible</u> to permitted uses
  - 4) S. 45(2) (a) (ii) *permission for the use* of land, building or structure that is <u>similar to the purpose or more compatible</u> with the by-law than a continuing legal non-conforming use
  - 5) S. 45(2) (b) permit uses *generally* defined of land, building or structure for any purpose that <u>conform with</u> uses permitted in the by-law.
  - 6) S. 45(3) minor variances from any specified by-law that implements an Official Plan on <u>subsection (1) terms (the 'Four Tests')</u>.



## 4. Conduct and Service Delivery

- Courtesy Firmness and Independence
- Site Visit
- Minimal intervention
- Access to Legal Counsel
- Year-end reporting to Council
- Avoidance of: conflict; familiarity; grounds for judicial review: 'Grounds' include:
  - Unreasonableness
  - Improper delegation /sub-delegation
  - Unauthorized discretion
  - Bad faith
  - Improper purpose
  - Excess of jurisdiction; exceeding the scope of the delegated power
  - Unconstitutionality: Charter and division of powers (Constitution Act, 1982)
  - Breach of natural justice/SPPA
  - Illegality, <u>ultra vires</u>
  - Failure to follow a statutory condition precedent
  - Unauthorized discrimination

- Structure: Introduction; Relief sought; Applicable tests/considerations; Merits and demerits support; Analysis; Disposition
- Conditions
- Contingent Orders



#### 9. TLAB IMAGE

- Accessibility and contemporary institution
- Performance and self-appraisal by members
- Standard of excellence in service, conduct, the administration of justice, disposition reasoning and self-control, co-operation
- Chairs responsibilities: liaison; spokesperson; members complaints; conduct complaint investigations; Decision review for clarity, quality, issues of legality (not judgement, merit or factual determinations); Reviews; assignments; attendances at sittings of members; reporting
- Consideration of the public and the public interest
