MURAL LIST

Murals on north side of Dundas, east to west:

- 1 4868 Dundas – 2011 “Hurricane Hazel” site
- 2 4884 Dundas – “Portraits from our Past” is four abstract minimalist style works based on old area photos. Sarah Collard, 2008.
- 3 4946 Dundas – “The Pub with No Beer,” is a scene from Prohibition Era Islington. John Kuna, 2009.
- 4 4968 Dundas – “Gordon’s Dairy,” was a local landmark on this site during the 1940s. John Kuna, 2008.
- 5 4972 Dundas – “The Way We Were,” shows Dundas St. West, looking east from Cordova Avenue around 1900. John Kuna, 2005.
- 6 4984 Dundas – “The Way We Were, 2” shows that same intersection, looking northwest. John Kuna, 2006.
- 7 4986 Dundas – “Mimico Creek, fall 1920,” as it appeared before Islington Ave was extended north of Dundas, ca. 1962. John Kuna, 2008.
- 8 4988 Dundas – “Honouring Islington’s Volunteer Fire Brigade” and the skating rink they created and maintained on Mimico Creek in the 1940s. John Kuna, 2008.
- 9 4994 Dundas – “Harold G. Shipp’s First High Flier!” depicts a Lancaster Bomber and a 1944 promotion gone awry. John Kuna, 2008.

10 5048 Dundas – 2011 “Prodigy” mural site

11 5110 Dundas – “Riding the Radials,” shows the electric streetcar that ran through Islington from 1917 to 1931. John Kuna, 2008.

12 5112 Dundas – 2011 “Child’s Play” mural site

13 5126 Dundas – “The Old Swimming Hole,” is an artist’s conception of the millpond below a derelict sawmill on Mimico Creek, near Burnhamthorpe Park Blvd. John Kuna, 2009.

Murals on south side of Dundas, west to east:

14 4959 Dundas – “Timeline,” is a continuum showing the same Islington street scene in 1880, 1950 and 2006. John Kuna, 2006.

15 4937 Dundas – “Briarly, Gone but Not Forgotten,” depicts the property known as Briarly, the Montgomery family’s home, 1870 to 1989. John Kuna, 2008.

16/ 4901 Dundas – “Faith of our Fathers, 2” depicts the history of the Islington United Church. It replaces “Faith, 1”, Islington’s first mural, now shown on the plaque. John Kuna, 2009.

18 4889 Dundas – Arts Etobicoke “Poem Mural.” Poem by Dionne Brand, design by Susan Rowe Harrison, painted by William Lazos.

19 4879 Dundas Dundas – “The Manse Committee,” depicts a typical white-gloved inspection of the minister’s residence originally located in this building. John Kuna, 2010.
